Virtual Access Customer Centres (VACCs)

A Virtual Access Customer Centre (VACC) is a place where you can go to access your court hearing online.

If you cannot appear remotely from a private location like your home, you can ask the Court to use a VACC.



How Do I Use a VACC?

Contact the Court before your hearing.

Send an email to the Court location or call the **Judiciary**

to inform the Court that you need

to use a VACC.



Where Can I Find a VACC?

There are VACCs in several different locations across Trinidad and Tobago:

- O'Meara, Arima
- Princes Town
- Rio Claro
- Mayaro
- Point Fortin
- Scarborough



Contact the Court to find a VACC near you.

Can I Get Help at a VACC?

Yes, you can!

Court staff will be available to guide and assist you. They can also show you how to use the VACCs to file court documents.
